# Non-Confidential Resources

- Non-confidential resources are required to report known assaults to the University.
- When a report is made, Title IX Office will contact the survivor to share resources and provide information about the campus adjudication process.
- If the name of an alleged perpetrator is mentioned during discussion of the assault, that person will be contacted by the University during the investigatory process.
- The survivor has the right to decide whether or not to participate in an investigation and file formal charges.

What They Can Do For You	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Provide Interim Measures/Remedies</li> <li>• No Contact Directives</li> <li>• Academic Assistance (assignment extensions; test rescheduling)</li> <li>• Assistance with class incompletes or drops</li> <li>• Victim Advocate referral</li> <li>• Counseling Service referral</li> <li>• Investigates reports of sexual violence, discrimination and harassment</li> <li>• Referral to Social Services Coordinator specializing in the unique challenges that impact undocumented and DACA students</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Investigates crimes that occur on campus to include sexual assaults, stalking, and domestic violence</li> <li>• Coordinates with Federal, State, and local Law Enforcement as well as the U.S. Attorney's office regarding the investigation and adjudication of crimes that occur on campus</li> <li>• Assists complainants with obtaining Temporary Protection Orders through the court</li> <li>• Serves and enforces Temporary Protection Orders as directed by the court</li> <li>• Provides safety escorts/rides to and from court, as well as on campus property</li> <li>• Provides safety escorts to all students on campus property</li> <li>• Provides assistance and guidance with court processes</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Can offer support and refer student to campus resources.</li> <li>• Assists in changing on-campus housing arrangements</li> </ul> <p><b>Examples:</b> resident assistants (RAs), resident directors (RDs), others</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Can offer support and refer student to campus resources</li> </ul> <p><b>Examples:</b> academic advisors, professors, lecturers, teaching assistants, researchers</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Assists with filing a formal conduct complaint</li> <li>• Coordinates with Title IX Office</li> <li>• Conducts hearings and processes for campus adjudications</li> </ul>
